
Citizenship in Action, state 4-H legislative event will be <u>February 16-17th, 2024.</u> **Register by January 24th.**

MARK YOUR CALENDARS FOR FEBRUARY 22, 2025 FOR COUNTY CLUB DAYS AT THE BURLINGTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Preparing for County and Regional Club Days

- Model Meetings: Must include one of each of the five main categories of motions - Main, subsidiary, incidental, privileged and unclassified.
- Model Meeting is a requirement to become eligible to receive a blue or purple seal
- All talks must pertain to a project that you are currently enrolled in.
- Music entries must bring the original sheet of music for the judge and have measures numbered.
- Instrumental entries do not have to be memorized.
- Pre-recorded music accompaniment is allowed
- Script required for readings

Important updates to Club Days:

- Project talks will now have two divisions
- ONLY at Club Days and Regionals
 - o Junior, age 7-9
 - o Intermediate, age 10-13
 - Two from each age division will qualify for Regional Club Days
- Readings will now have three divisions
 - o Junior, age 7-9
 - o Intermediate, age 10-13
 - o Senior, age 14-18
 - One from each age division will qualify for Regional Club Days
- Demo Days
 - o Project talk age, 7-11
 - ONLY one division



Breeding Beef

The deadline for initial ID of breeding heifers and Cow/Calf pairs is due the same day as Bucket Calf ID - April 16th. Pictures turned in to the Extension for ID's will continue to be required. Nominations at initial weigh-in for county fair may now be done in the family name with individual exhibitor's name to be declared at time of county fair entry. In addition, heifers "dual nominated" (market & breeding) at initial weigh-in MUST be declared one or the other at the time of county fair entry. Ear tag numbers of cows to be entered in the cow/calf pair class in the Coffey County Fair must be recorded that day.





ZBOOKS Online 4-H Record Keeping

Record keeping and Project Reporting are valuable skills taught to members of the Kansas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep a permanent record of all 4-H and non-4-H experiences and are encouraged to summarize their project experiences on the Kansas 4-H Project Report Form for project recognition.

To help you through this process, please refer to the <u>Guide</u> to <u>Kansas 4-H Project Recognition</u>. A few items to make note of include:

- Youth may choose to use either record keeping option:
 a.) the fillable PDF Project report forms or b.) the online ZBOOKS software
- The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks, do not feel like you have to transfer over all of your previous years' activities into the online Permanent Record. Start with this year and attach it to your previous document.
